April 7, 1948 - June 2, 2019

Gertrude Bradley Parham, affectionately known as “Trudy” grew up in Orlando, Florida until she graduated from Jones High School. Gertrude moved to Memphis, Tennessee to attend LeMoyne-Owen (LeMoyne) College, where she received a bachelors degree in sociology/psychology. During her final semester of school, Trudy married Louis Parham (Linda) who eventually became the late Reverend Louis Parham (deceased June, 2018). To this union was born one son, Sidney William Parham.

After college, Trudy and her family resided in Memphis before moving to Columbia, Tennessee. Upon arrival, they joined Mount Lebanon Missionary Baptist Church under the leadership of the late David Williams, Sr., Pastor. Sister Trudy spent most of life being a servantleader in her church and community. In her church, Trudy served in different ministries as an alternate teacher for weekly bible study, on the bereavement committee, budget committee, chairperson for Christian education, trustee, usher as needed and occasionally, sang in the choir (smile). In her community, Sis. Trudy was actively participating as, the President of the Women department of Duck River, until her health failed. Even though Trudy was battling her illness, she never gave up, she continued to have Bible Study with her church family every Wednesday night.

Gertrude “Trudy” Parham was the sole proprietor of The Bradley HRT Group, a human resource consulting and training firm, in Nashville and Columbia, Tennessee. Her mission: “Training People to Produce”. Prior to her own business, Trudy was co-owner of Arrival, Inc. She also sold Amway products for a while, and World Book Encyclopedia (during a time when computers didn't exist). Trudy’s last venture was Juice Plus product. Throughout Trudy’s history in Tennessee, she used her

professional services to train a lot of people including Pastor Gregory Givens, and other Pastors in the Tennessee area.

Trudy was a special friend, sister, aunt, and cousin to her family, and “we” looked forward to her visits, our spiritual talks, church, educational tours to civil rights museums and theme parks. She will be missed by all of us!

She was preceded in death by parents: Napoleon Bradley, Sr. and Corine Bradley (Crippen), and sister: Patricia F. Johnson.

Trudy leaves to mourn her son, Sidney William Parham of Columbia, Tennessee; grandchildren: Deconious Aubreyz Green of Smyrna, Tennessee and Zahriya S.
