Corinne Cooper Johnson was born on December 6, 1951 in Quincy, Florida to Roosevelt Cooper and Katherine Sapp Cooper. Corinne was the first of six children: 3-girls, and 3-boys.

Corinne attended St. John Elementary School in Quincy, FL, where she played a year of basketball. In 1964, Corinne moved to Orlando, FL with her family, where she attended Jones High School (Jones). During her time at Jones, Corinne met who would later become, the love of her life, Marvin O. Johnson. Marvin and Corinne began dating in the 9th grade, and instantly became high school sweethearts. After completing her education and graduating from Jones in 1969, Corinne went on to attend Valencia Community College, where she received her Associates of Arts Degree.

Corinne had many jobs during the span of her life. This included working for WOKB radio station and working in the business office at Orlando Regional Medical Center. She also worked for private doctors in the medical field. Corinne ended her career working 25 years at The Orlando Heart Center, as a Patient Liaison, where she would retire in December 2016. She enjoyed her free time spending it with loved ones.

Prior to moving to Orlando, Corinne was a member of St. Hebron A.M.E. Church in Quincy, FL. Once Corinne moved to Orlando with her family, she attended Mt. Calvary Missionary Baptist Church. After Corinne married Marvin in May 1972, she then became a member of St. Paul A.M.E. Church (now Greater St. Paul AME Church) of Orlando, FL, where she remained for over 40 years. There she faithfully served as a Sunday School teacher, President of the Stewardess, and was a member of the Central Conference of the 11th Episcopal District --- African Methodist Episcopal Church Women's Missionary Society, where she served as 1st Vice President of the Gracie M. Bowen Women's Missionary Society. Corinne's faith in God was unwavering and she made sure to share the word of Christ wherever she went.

Corinne was an avid Florida State University (FSU) football fan and spent over 20 years attending games with her husband. The two would travel all over the State of Florida to go and see "Their Noles" play. She was also a proud FSU Mom, of which both of her daughters performed in the FSU Marching Chiefs and graduated.

Corinne was preceded in death by her parents, Roosevelt Cooper and Katherine Sapp Cooper, and one brother, Franklin R. Cooper.

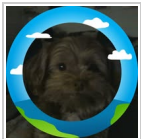
