Bethesda Full Gospel where Pastor Billy White was pastor, and the Greater Faith Bible Tabernacle Church with the late Bishop Nathan S. Halton where Pastor Brown was licensed as an Evangelist.

Pastor Dorothy Brown retired from the Buffalo Board of Education. At the time of her retirement she worked at school #61, where she impacted children's lives for close to 30 years. Dorothy was a union representative. She worked with the Mayor's Youth Summer Program as well. Dorothy enjoyed cooking and was well known for her macaroni and cheese and sweet potato pies. Often times cooking for seniors and the indigent.
