Eula Mae Adams-Davis was born June 30, 1943 in Estill, South Carolina. She was the third of five children, born to Helen Adams. Eula attended Blake High School in Tampa, Florida.

Eula moved to Tampa, Florida in the late 1950's and in time met a young man by the name of Leo Davis. They were married on July 16, 1961, and eventually settled in Altamonte Springs, Florida. To their union seven sons and one daughter was born.

Exemplifying her talents, Eula was employed by the Second Harvest Food Bank in which she excelled in workmanship before retiring in 2008.

Eula loved the Lord and was a faithful member of Ward Chapel A.M.E. Church in Winter Park, Florida where she diligently served as a Stewart, Church School Teacher, Usher, YPD Director, 1st Vice of the Cora Jackson Missionary

Society, along with leading the Culinary Committee. Eula's talents stretched to her position of 2nd Vice on the Reed-Cole Area, a WMS Life Member, and WMS Member at Large on the Conference.

Eula didn't limit her love to just her church, her love was demonstrated by action as she distributed her services among all she had the pleasure of meeting. She was known as the one who feeds, clothes and houses those in need. One of Eula's favorite charities was "Every Kid Outreach" but she didn't restrain herself in showing love to numerous missions, Thanksgiving and Christmas baskets, Food Pantry implementation at multiple churches. Besides her missionary work, Eula gave her time as a Voter Registration employee.

On August 31, 2023, Eula received and accepted her special invitation to rest from earthly cares and awaits the second coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

She is preceded in death by her loving husband, Leo Davis Sr., mother, Helen Adams; brothers, David Adams Jr. and John Lee Adams.
