August 17, 1936 - November 26, 2025

Fannie Mae Banks was born on August 17, 1936, in Hurtsboro, Alabama, to parents Jessie Lee Cobb and Queen Nell Cobb. She was educated in the Public Schools of Russell County. She attended night school later in life and received her G.E.D. Fannie Mae attended Nero Baptist Church in Hurtsboro, Alabama. Early in her life, she gave her heart to Christ and received the Lord as her personal Lord and Savior under the leadership of Pastor Pugh. Fannie Mae met her husband, Bradford Banks, Sr., at an early age. As a young wife and then mother, God blessed their union with 3 loving children: Queen, Betty Jean and Bradford, Jr.

Later in life, Bradford and Fannie Mae moved and settled in Orlando, Florida, where she worked at Dobb's House International for 20 years. She also worked as a part-time school crossing guard for 2 more years before officially retiring. After a long illness, Bradford Banks, Sr., passed away at the age of 67. Fannie Mae later met and married Mr. Carvin Jones on March 5, 1996. He was a devoted husband and was always by her side.

In the early 1970's they both joined St. Luke Baptist Church under the leadership of Pastor Curtis Lee Wilson. She loved gospel music, cooking, and baking. Fannie Mae departed this life on Wednesday, November 26, 2025, at Bedrock Nursing Home after a long illness.

She was preceded in death by her father, Jessie Lee Cobb; mother, Queen Nell Cobb; brothers: Jessie Lee Cobb, Jr., Eddie Lee Cobb, Joe Cobb, and Willie Cobb; sister, Earlie B. Jones.
