Johnnie Miller Jr., son of the late Johnnie Miller Sr. and Rosa Lee Johnson Miller, was born November 5, 1931 in Madison, Florida.

He was the oldest of three children born from this union. He was preceded in death by his brother Frank Miller of Orlando FL, and survived by his sister Sarah Solomon of Madison, Florida. Johnnie attended the public schools of Madison County and worked diligently with his father in the cotton fields and hauling merchandise before leaving at a very young age to pursue a better life for himself. He gained employment in Orlando, Florida where he worked diligently for several years learning the roofing trade before pursuing his own successful business Johnnie Miller's Roofing Company. Johnnie worked diligently in the roofing industry for over 40 years while living and raising his family as a residence in the historic Town of Eatonville "1887". He was deeply involved in building and supporting other black owned businesses to help strengthen the local black economy. He was given the nickname "Biggim" by his employees for providing many jobs to any man who was willing to work hard and had the desire to

support their families during difficult times. He was a devoted follower of Jesus Christ serving in the areas of a Deacon and Usher at Mt. Carmel Missionary Baptist Church. Johnnie was a strong pillar for his family, church, and the local black community.

Throughout the course of time, Johnnie married the love of his life Luemetter Watkins Miller of 54 years, before she proceeded him in death in November of 2008. He was also proceeded in death by his loving and devoted daughter Treva Miller in October of 2019.

Johnnie's beautiful life will forever be cherished in the lives of his children: Janice Crane (James), Johnnie Lavon Miller (Beverly), Dexter Miller, David Miller, Linda McClain (Al), Joyce Hall (William), Bernard Miller, Patricia Miller, Christopher Miller (Teresa), Michael Miller (Angela), Evelyn Miller, Tammie Jordan (Ronald), Sharineen Miller (Cynthia), and Quintin Miller; 32 grandchildren, 23 great-grandchildren, along with a host of devoted nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.
