Most people who feel called into education and who are willing to take on the stress, parent meetings, paperwork, and minimal pay probably have somewhat of a tender heart for children and a desire to make their lives and the world a better place, anyway. After all, that's why we do what we do. Julia came to us in education from the business world and she knew that in order to "sell" education or teach children anything, she had to build relationships with them first. Once students knew that she loved, cared and believed in them as she did her own children,

they'd then trust her to toughen up and challenge them. They were receptive and willing to learn.

As a friend, Julia is now the person for whom I both mourn and celebrate. I loved her. She was the kind of friend that I could pick up the phone to call when I needed to laugh at myself or situations to which we'd both been privy. My husband and I often went out together with Julia and her husband on couples night out as we enjoyed Jazz. Our families (together with our children and my grandchildren) have even vacationed, together.

Julia's passing was sudden and unexpected, but her life was not faint by any means, nor void of who our Savior is. Over the years that I've known her, she'd often asked for prayer (as we all do) during the struggles of life. From a mutual friend, I learned that she had in fact accepted Jesus as her Lord and Savior.

Her memory will always be with me, and I know her legacy will continue through her children and all who knew her. If Julia were here with us today. I believe she would have some funny story to tell us all to make everyone laugh and feel comfortable, and we would (even if just for a moment) forget our sadness. I will miss my friend dearly, but I am so grateful for having known her.
