“My journey through the wooded trails of the farming community in Blakely, Georgia ended when I arrived at my destination - the small Baptist Church in nearby Bancroft, Georgia, I had walked for miles to attend the prayer meetings and revivals held here. It was here as a young girl that I began learning about God’s commandments, the life of Jesus Christ, and the coming Kingdom of God. The organization of the church and inviting atmosphere of the church provided structure that helped strengthen me in the teaching of the Bible. I enjoyed learning the joys of God through the songs, teaching of the services and servings of our minister. These teachings instilled within me a sense of resolve and hope with a promise of a better way of life. Lilla Teartt later met and married the late Marvin Randall. Through this union, they had three girls and two boys. They eventually settled in Eatonville, Florida.

Lilla Randall was an advocate for education. She believed that we must continue to pursue knowledge and become lifelong learners. She actively served her community as a member of the zoning board and as the first Hungerford Elementary PTA President. She made sure her children had access to opportunities that her generation was not able to have. Mrs. Randall served as a dedicated Sunday School teacher throughout her life. She prided herself as being a steward of God, often visiting the sick and shut in.

Lilla was preceded in death by her husband: Marvin Randall; parents: Willie Lee and Johnny B. Teartt; son: Marvin Randall, Jr.; brothers: T.J. Teartt and Johnnie Teartt; sister: Hazel Mays.

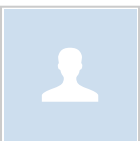
