Maxwell Andrew Carrington was born in Belmont, on the beautiful Island of Trinidad and Tobago. He was the 7th of 8 children. His parents were dedicated to Christian education and from his early years his education began in St. Vincent with home schooling from his mother. When the family returned to Trinidad and Tobago, he attended Southern Academy and Bates Memorial High School where he completed his high school education. He had many friends, and from his youth was involved in church activities. He often liked to talk about his trips with his dad to the remotest parts of the island, to meet or visit with church members. Since his father served as Education and Missionary Volunteer Secretary for the Caribbean Union Conference, Max was introduced to working with the youth. Max was not only Adventist Youth

leader, but was very much part of a vibrant drama club.

Max attended Caribbean Union College, now known as Southern Caribbean University. After graduation he was called to work as manager of the Adventist Book Center in Barbados. There he revived the Pathfinders club, for which he is always remembered. In Barbados he was ordained as a church elder and accepted this responsibility as a call from God. His greatest desire then was to grow spiritually, which only increased as time went on.

In 1967 he returned to Trinidad to marry the former Mayna Ince whom he had met and admired since Junior camp and Pathfinders. This friendship lasted throughout the years.

Having served a few years in Barbados he was called to Guyana, South America to manage the Adventist Book Center. There he was also appointed Youth Director and was asked to be in charge of two churches, as they waited for the new pastor to arrive. Max served faithfully until he decided to migrate to North America to pursue a higher education. This journey took him through Canada and finally to the USA. In Maryland he attended Columbia Union College.

After graduation he was employed by Howard University. There he worked as Assistant Director of Materials Management where he developed a new department of Central Services. The new department negotiated purchasing contracts and reissuing supplies to about 200 university departments. This program resulted in saving the university millions of dollars for office furniture and equipment.

Throughout his life Max was dedicated to the church and served in several capacities including Pathfinders Director, Deacon, Treasurer, and Youth Director. He also served as Board Member of the Finance Committee of the

G.E. Peters Elementary School. He was a member of the Executive Committee of the Allegheny East Conference. He was a charter member of the Metropolitan SDA Church and served as First Elder for many years. He was a member of the Metropolitan Steel Orchestra from its inception.

After 30 years at Howard University he retired and moved to Florida, where he remained active in both church and his alma mater. Max also served as a dedicated elder of the Mt Olive SDA church in Florida. He was loved and respected, a friend and counsellor with words of encouragement for all. He lived an exemplary life of service to church and family.

His hobbies included watching professional sports, playing the steel pan, travelling, and fishing.

On September 30th 2020 he quietly went to sleep. This devoted child of God leaves to mourn him: his dear wife of 52 years, Mayna; his loving children Emile and Nikki; his sisters Myrtle (Dennis, deceased), Sheila, Carol, and Christine; Brothers Frank (Michelle), George (Shirley), Phillip (Sylvia); Cousins Rawle (Jeanette), Arnim (Cathleen), Mae (John), Janet (Allan), Nigel (Monica, deceased), and Alban (Sandra) and a host of nieces and nephews.
