



Reverend Nathaniel "Nature Boy" James

February 20, 1943 - January 21, 2026

Born and raised in Bartow, Florida, Pastor Nathaniel "Nature Boy" James was a man of deep faith, strong family values, and a heart for service. As the beloved son of the late Freddie and Ruth James, he was raised with guiding principles that shaped his life and legacy. He graduated from Union Academy High School in 1964 and went on to pursue higher education at Florida A&M University (FAMU) in Tallahassee, Florida, where he earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Education in 1968. He later continued his religious studies at the International Bible Seminary, where he received his Degree of Divinity in Homiletics in 1987.

While at FAMU, Pastor James excelled both academically and athletically, becoming a standout football and track star. It was also during this time that he met Gwendolyn Manigault, the love of his life. What began as a college romance blossomed into a beautiful, lifelong partnership. Together, they shared more than 59 years of marriage, building a life rooted in faith, love, and unwavering commitment.

Nathaniel's athletic talent led him to the NFL, where he played for the Cleveland Browns and the New Orleans Saints, before continuing his professional career with the Montreal Alouettes in the Canadian Football League. Over the years, he was honored with induction into multiple Hall of Fame programs, including the Florida A&M University Hall of Fame for his

exceptional contributions to football and track & field; the Track & Field Hall of Fame for his performance in the Penn Relays; and the Union Academy Hall of Fame for his accomplishments as an elite athlete.

Yet beyond sports and recognition, it was Pastor James' faith that truly guided his life and shaped his purpose. That strong foundation led him toward a lifelong commitment to service and leadership. For 33 years, he faithfully served the Orange County Public School System as a teacher and coach, impacting countless students and mentoring generations of young athletes. Many of those relationships remained strong over the years, as former students continued to express gratitude for the wisdom, discipline, and care he poured into their lives.

During this time, Nathaniel also answered the call to ministry, delivering his first sermon at St. John Independent Free Methodist Church. His passion for the Word and love for people only grew stronger, and in 1986, he became the Senior Pastor of St. Luke Free Methodist Church in Orange Bend, Florida. With a gentle spirit, steady leadership, and a compassionate heart, Pastor James dedicated decades to encouraging others, strengthening families, and serving his community through the love of Christ.

Pastor Nathaniel James leaves behind a legacy of strength, service, faith, and love. He shared 59 wonderful years of marriage with his beloved wife, Gwendolyn James, who preceded him in death. He is survived by: his children, Nathaniel Gregory James (Kim) of Altamonte Springs, Florida; Neill James of Maitland, Florida; and Nicholas James (Jennifer) of Apopka, Florida. He is also survived by: his beloved brother, Freddie James of Miami, Florida; sister-in-law, Claudia Jean Hires (Eddison); and brothers-in-law, Claudius Manigault, Jr. of Longwood, Florida, and John (Faye) Manigault of Longwood, Florida.

His legacy continues through his grandchildren, NaTasha James, Arielle Young (Chris), Nicole James, NaKayla James, Gregory James, Shayla James, Karter James, Ky'Elle James, Nia James, and Jordan James; and three great-grandchildren, Reyelle Sands, Dequarius Harper, and Reythaniel Sands.

He is also survived by a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and cherished church family members who loved him dearly and will continue to carry his spirit forward. Pastor Nathaniel James lived a life marked by faith, family, and unwavering dedication to serving others. His impact will be felt for generations to come.

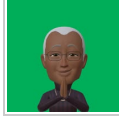

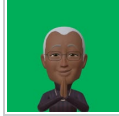
