Pauline Beatrice Mabry was born on May 2, 1944 in Eustis, FL, to Ernestine Martin and England Williams. From a young age, she stood out with her kind heart, strong will, and graceful spirit. She graduated from Milner Rosenwald Academy She attended International Seminary for a major in Theology. She was a teacher at Phylis Wheatley Elementary, She worked at Zellwood Daycare Center which inspired her to reach out to the residents and pushed for the first self help homes to be built in Zellwood, FL, by going door to door to get the residents to complete applications. She was a woman of action. She was a part of the class action Law Suit brought against Lake County School Board in the 70's for removing Black administrators out of their positions in the schools. She was the founder of Women Of Color Breast Cancer Awareness which provided free Breast exams for women in The East Town Community. Though she is no longer with us, her love and light continues her family and all who knew her.
