Renard Gales was a hardworking family man dedicated to a life of duty and service. Born June 26, 1959 to Dorothy Gales in Atlanta. Renard was a twin, and the fifth of ten children. While in high school, he wore number 63; he was nicknamed "Tiny Feet." Despite his toughness on the field, he graduated in the top 10% of his class. He proved he was as smart as he was athletic. Upon graduation in '77, he joined the U.S. Army where he served for 18 years, retiring in 1995. In '96, Renard joined American Freightways as a mechanic, and soon fell in love with driving. In 2001, FedEx bought American Freightways, and Renard drove for them until he passed. With his no-nonsense leadership, yet being lovingly approachable, Renard built a family at FedEx, forging a strong brotherhood with his co-workers. Renard continued his love for driving by providing transportation services for his church.

Renard married twice, his first marriage produced two children: Josh and Ashlei Gales. In 2009, Renard married Carolyn Denise, who he called his "Gift from God." They experienced a beautiful partnership until he passed. Renard welcomed Carolyn's two sons with open arms, and was an excellent husband and father as he was a soldier and brother.

Throughout his life, Renard set the example for diligence and responsibility as a man, strength and resilience as a person, and steadfast faith as a believer. He was a great example to us all.
