January 11, 1931 - February 3, 2015

On January 11, in the year of our Lord, 1931. A son was born to Mr. Albert and Epsie Robinson, they smiled upon the face of their middle born son and named him Rodtha Robinson.

As a young boy, Rodtha attended Clinton Valley Elementary and Shallow. Rodtha had a drive to succeed at a very early age, he moved from Notasulga, Alabama to Apopka, Florida where he met Ms. Mae Willie Miller and from that union they had a daughter Gayle. Rodtha then moved to Syracuse, New York. He started working with the Central Regional Transportation where he drove a city bus for over 20 years. During his time in Syracuse he met and married Idelia Dunham, from that union they had a son, Terrance Robinson. Rodtha later confessed his call to the ministry where he was the founder and pastor of New Zion Church of Deliverance. He was called by God into the Pentecostal Denomination. Under his Pastoralship he started the first Outreach Ministry in his area.

Reverend Robinson spent the remainder of his Servitude until his health began to fail. Reverend Robinson accepted other responsibilities and worked hard instilling the Word of God in others.

Many of you may remember Reverend Robinson as an Independent Consultant of Tahitian Noni now known as Morida where he worked his way

up as Jade Rep. one of the lead positions.

Later Rodtha moved back to Apopka, Florida where he met and reunited with a long time friend Mary Ann Taylor they were married.

Latter years passed Rodtha moved to Atlanta, Georgia, he remarried Idelia Robinson.

Oh what a joy when the Lord said at 1:28pm Tuesday, February 3, 2015
“Come hither my good and faithful servant”. At that time Reverend Rodtha Robinson reached the end of the road of life and entered into the heavenly gates of eternity. His memory will linger with us forever.

“Super fine getting better all the time” and “I can’t help it.”
