Willie Dean Caison, aka: “Bo”, was born on March 21, 1931, to the late J. C. Caison of Dawson, Georgia, and the late Louise Marshall Banks. He attended the public schools in Dawson, Georgia, and graduated from George Washington Carver HS in 1950.

He honorably served his country in the United States Army during the Korean War, completing four (4) years of military service. His Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) was Special Services. He furthered his military education through training at the U.S. Military Academy, West Point, and Officer Candidate School (OCS).

He later relocated to Newark, New Jersey, where he proudly served as a police officer for several years. He eventually relocated to the “Sunshine State” and settled permanently in Orlando, Florida.
