



Willie J. Hull, Jr.

July 3, 1941 - June 15, 2025

Willie James Hull was born on July 3rd, 1941 to Rosie Lee (ncc Witchett) and Willie Henry Hull in F. Gaines. Georgia. He was the only child of this union and was surrounded by a large, loving family.

Although he was born in Georgia, his mother, Rosie, moved from Georgia and traveled extensively around the country until settling in Sharpes, FL. Consequently, the entire family - which consisted of her grandmother, mother, uncles and aunts, and many cousins-relocated to Sharpes, FL. They bought land and built homes in Sharpes. Willie grew up in Sharpes for a few years before his mother moved to Cocoa, FL, where she met and married Till Johnson, who reared Willie to adulthood. Willie Henry Hull, Rosie Lee Johnson, and Till Johnson, respectively, preceded Willie in death.

To say that Willie's life was quite extraordinary is an understatement! He was multitalented and excelled at everything he did. He attended and graduated with honors from Monroe High School in Cocoa, FL. He excelled in music and was the Band Leader of his marching band. He was sought after by many colleges and universities but decided to pursue a music career instead. He was very successful, performing with James Brown, Otis Redding, Sam Cooke, among many others. His music career was cut short when he was drafted into the Army during the Vietnam War. He was seriously injured and totally disabled while serving his country.

Willie was known by a huge contingent of family, friends, businessmen, and acquaintances. He was affectionately called "Bubu" by his sister, "Stick" by family, and "Hull" by others. He owned a restaurant, Rib Shack, that was quite successful as well. Willie loved his family and was devoted to our Lord Jesus Christ, who was the most important element in his life. Whenever there was a need, he was there. He was generous to a fault, and you could hear his booming laughter a block away! He was always laughing and joyous.

Willie had too many accomplishments to acknowledge in this brief recount of his life. He was very active until the end. He was involved in several organizations, including Jupiter Lodge #22. He was diligently involved in his church as the Treasurer and was greatly beloved by Pastor Wendell C. Webster and the congregation of New Bethel A.M.E. Church. He was also a member of the Richard Allen Men's Ministry (RAMS), an auxiliary of New Bethel A.M.E. Church.

Willie James Hull lived his life to the fullest. He traveled all over the world, but his greatest achievement was his choice to serve our Lord Jesus Christ, which was instilled in him by his mother, Rosie Lee. He is now in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ and reunited with all his loved ones.
